University Students' Council of Western University

Clubs Governance Committee Terms of Reference

Authority: Council	Date Ratified: April 4, 2018
	Previous Amendments: October 8, 2015. October 26, 2016

1. Objective

To govern the clubs' community on campus by enforcing and overseeing policies and procedures to ensure fairness in the clubs' culture.

2. Mandate

- 2.1. To create a community that supports leadership development among students and welcome the wide range of interests within the Clubs Community.
 - 2.2. To adhere to all the documents of the Clubs Policy to determine reasonable limits placed on student organizations in order to comply with USC policy as well as University policy.
 - 2.3. To set strategic, long-term goals for the Clubs Community for future growth and development of clubs and their student leaders.

3. Composition

3.1.	The Clubs Governance Committee (CGC) shall be composed of:
3.1.1.	Clubs Policy Coordinator, ex-officio, chair, non-voting.
3.1.2.	Associate Clubs, ex-officio, vice-chair, non-voting.
3.1.3.	Clubs Finance Coordinator, ex-officio, non-voting.
3.1.4.	Seven (7) undergraduate students-at-large who are not Members of Council, voting.
3.1.5.	Compliance Coordinator, ex-officio, non-voting.
3.1.6.	Student Programs Officer, ex-officio, non-voting.
3.1.7.	Associate Governance, ex-officio, non-voting.

- 3.2. The USC Executive, and other USC staff, shall be available as a resource to CGC should the committee request their presence.
- 3.3. A CGC member shall not be a current member of any club executive.
- 3.4. There shall be two sub-committees of CGC,
 - 3.4.1. Club Policy Review Committee.
 - 3.4.2. Financial Review Committee

4. Duties of the Officers

- 4.1. The Chair of the Clubs Governance Committee shall:
 - 4.1.1. Set the agenda for each scheduled meeting.



- 4.1.2. Ensure all CGC documents are filed with the Compliance Coordinator and the appropriate USC staff members.
- 4.1.3. Ensure CGC meetings are carried out in a fair and equitable manner.
- 4.1.4. Ensure CGC has relevant information and documentation provided to it prior to any meeting and in accordance with any deadlines provided in this policy.
- 4.1.5. Ensure quorum is maintained and to otherwise adjourn the meeting.
- 4.1.6. Be given the right to extend invitations to the persons who could offer supplementary information relevant to the decisions made by the CGC.
- 4.1.7. Ensure the appropriate procedure has been followed prior to making any decisions.
- 4.2. The Vice-Chair of the Clubs Governance Committee shall:
 - 4.2.1. Assist the Chair in the member selection of CGC.
 - 4.2.2. Absorb the roles of the Chair in their absence.
 - 4.2.3. Ensure all pertinent issues are brought before the CGC.
 - 4.2.4. Advise the CGC of any immediate actions taken in accordance with the Clubs Policy, and the reasons for taking such actions.
 - 4.2.5. Provide the CGC with any relevant information pertaining to the functioning of the clubs' community.
 - 4.2.6. Provide any relevant information or documentation to assist the CGC to arrive at an informed decision.
 - 4.2.7. Represent the CGC in front of the Appeals Board if necessary.
 - 4.2.8. Submit an annual report by January 31st to the Student Experience Standing Committee
 - 4.2.9. Vote in the instance of a tie
- 4.3. The Compliance Coordinator shall:
 - 4.3.1. Take, or appoint an individual to take, minutes for each CGC meeting.
 - 4.3.2. Report to the CGC on any club issues having to do with USC or Western University policy
 - 4.3.3. Provide any relevant information or documentation to assist the CGC to arrive at an informed decision.
 - 4.3.4. Provide context and institutional memory with respect to specific events/activities of clubs, past CGC decisions and USC and University policies.
 - 4.3.5. Provide explanations to committee members regarding policies enforced by the USC and University in relation to student organizations, risk management, event management, insurance, sponsorship policies,
 - budget procedures, alcohol policy, university policy, community standards policy, public safety issues, venue issues, etc.
- 5. Responsibilities of the Committee
 - 5.1. The responsibilities of CGC shall be:
 - 5.1.1. Ratify qualified organizations as USC clubs.
 - 5.1.2. Uphold and enforce all USC By-laws and club policies and procedures.
 - 5.1.3. Seek and consider recommendations made by sub-committees of CGC.
 - 5.1.4. Approve club constitution changes or provide clubs with recommendations to assist the club to receive approval of the CGC.
 - 5.1.5. Task the Associate Clubs to conduct an investigation or to designate an individual(s) to conduct further investigations where the CGC believes it has insufficient information before it in order to come to a more informed decision.
 - 5.1.6. Determine whether or not a club has violated the Clubs Policy or any other governing document of the USC, or the University of Western Ontario by extension, and impose sanctions where appropriate.
 - 5.1.7. Undertake any further actions or decisions necessary to ensure that all clubs abide by the Clubs Policy.
 - 5.1.8. Task sub-committees of the CGC with reviewing specific clubs, group of clubs, or all clubs under the purview of the USC.



- 5.1.9. Receive reports and recommendations from the sub-committees of CGC in order to deliberate and enact them.
- 5.2. Committee members shall abide by the USC's Conflict of Interest Policy. Conflicts of interest must be reported to the Associate Clubs and filed with the Compliance Coordinator.
- 5.3. The CGC members shall abide by the following attendance requirements
 - 5.3.1. Attend all meetings set by the Chair; and,
 - 5.3.2. Be absent for no more than two (2) meetings in either semester
- 5.4. A CGC member shall not be considered absent from a meeting where an absence is the result of:
 - 5.4.1. A death or family emergency;
 - 5.4.2. An unavoidable medical appointment; or,
 - 5.4.3. An unavoidable academic requirement (i.e. exam);
- 5.5. A CGC member shall be removed in accordance with By-Law #1
- 5.6. CGC shall have the capacity to amend its term of references as well as those of its subcommittees'.

Objective

The University Students' Council (USC) seeks to create a community that supports leadership development among students and welcomes the wide range of interests within the Clubs Community. The Clubs Support Committee (CSC) is the body of the Clubs Community that supports collaboration among student organizations and seeks to enhance communication between student organizations and the USC. The committee is responsible for organizing community-wide initiative such as Clubs Week and workshops for the benefit of club executives and members. The CSC is influential in supporting the yearlong working dynamic within club executive teams (specifically regarding finances and promotion) and ultimately for the long-term development of the club within the Clubs Community. This policy applies to all members of the CSC by outlining general responsibilities to create a community of leadership and support.

2. Composition

- 2.1. The Clubs Support Committee (CSC) shall be composed of:
 - 2.1.1. Associate Clubs, *ex-officio*, as Chair;
 - 2.1.2. Clubs Support Coordinator, ex-officio;
 - 2.1.3. Up to five (5) students of the University who are not General or Executive members of a club within the USC Clubs Community;
 - 2.1.4. Up to ten (10) students of the University who are not members of an Executive Committee of a Club within the USC Clubs Community;
 - 2.1.5. Associate Finance, ex-officio, non-voting
- 2.2. The Student Programs Officer and Compliance Department shall be available as resource support to the CSC
- 2.3. A USC Ratified Club can only have representation from one (1) Committee Member.

3. Member Responsibilities

- 3.1. A committee member of the CSC shall:
 - 3.1.1. Report to the CSC;
 - 3.1.2. Attend meetings as determined by the Chair;
 - 3.1.3. Respect the rights, personal privileges and affiliations of all Club Executives, general members and USC administration and staff:
 - 3.1.4. Perform duties, as determined by the Chair, in carrying out all responsibilities and goals of the CSC; and,
 - 3.1.5. Be committed to providing support to clubs and related activities throughout the academic year

4. Responsibilities of the Committee

- 4.1. All Members shall:
 - 4.1.1. Work, and be compensated for, Clubs Week (if available);
 - 4.1.2. Be a sub-committee of the Clubs Governance Committee (CGC);

- 4.1.3. Report to the CGC and make recommendations based on feedback from specific clubs;
- 4.1.4. Make general decisions and recommendations based on a consensus model;
- 4.1.5. Serve as a brainstorming and active body in the development of the USC Clubs Community;
- 4.1.6. Organize, promote and plan club related initiatives which include but are not limited to Clubs Week (September and January), seminars, workshops, open-forms, town halls, clubs gala;
- 4.1.7. Plan one (1) Clubs Community wide initiative per academic term; and
- 4.1.8. Enhance and providing ongoing means of communication among all USC clubs and the USC.

4.2. Finance Members shall:

- 4.2.1. Consist of:
 - 4.2.1.1. Up to five (5) students who are not current General or Executive club members in the USC Clubs Community;
 - 4.2.1.2. The Associate Finance as a resource member
- 4.2.2. Assist clubs with financial procedures as necessary (Related document: Club Financial Procedures); and
- 4.2.3. Conduct reviews of clubs as directed by the CGC or Student Programs Officer
- 4.3. Online Activities Members shall:
 - 4.3.1. Consist of up to three (3) students who are not members of an Executive Committee of a Club within the USC Clubs Community;
 - 4.3.2. Focus on assisting on the maintenance, development and promotion of Western Clubs social media accounts; and
 - 4.3.3. Will operate the Western Clubs online feedback form.



Motion 4

Reducing Financial Barriers for Faculty, Off-Campus, and Affiliate Sophs

Whereas, Sophs volunteer their time throughout orientation week and the academic year to ensure that new students have an enjoyable and successful first year at Western;

Whereas, the current Soph Fee (\$30) and Soph uniform (up to \$100) is a combined \$130 and is a large financial burden for Sophs, especially considering that Sophing is done on a voluntary basis;

Whereas, the Faculty Soph Team Reserve has been increased to \$7000 in the 2018-2019 USC budget;

Be it resolved that, Council task the Student Programs Officer with creating a formal application and disbursement process for the Faculty Soph Team Reserve that all faculty, off-campus, and affiliate Sophs can access;

Be it further resolved that, this process be implemented and advertised to Sophs before Soph fee collection begins for the 2018-2019 academic year and all subsequent years;

Be it further resolved that, council task the Student Programs Officer to work with the necessary parties in the long-term to reduce the \$30 Soph Fee, including but not limited to investigating the feasibility of incorporating all or part of this fee into the Orientation Fee.

Item:	Reducing Financial Barriers for Faculty, Off-Campus, and Affiliate Sophs

Purpose of Report:	For Information

Recommendation

It is the recommendation of the Student Experience Committee:

That Council task the Student Programs Officer with creating a formal application and disbursement process for the faculty soph team reserve in time for 2018-2019 academic year, advertising this to sophs before soph fees are due, and working with the orientation program on a long-term time frame to reduce financial barriers to sophing.

Summary of Considerations

Member Councillors considered the following:

- 1. Faculty, off-campus, and affiliate sophs are volunteers, but are expected to pay a \$30 soph fee, up to \$100 for their uniforms, and numerous undocumented costs.
- 2. The results of the survey regarding financial barriers to sophing (Appendix 3).
- 3. The faculty soph team reserve has increased to \$7000 in the 2018-2019 budget.
- 4. This is currently no formal process for disbursing money from the reserve.
- 5. The Coordinator, Orientation Initiatives has expressed a desire for the reduction of financial barriers to sophing.
- 6. The incoming Student Programs Officer has indicated her desire to promote Soph subsidies.

Context of the Issue(s) to be Addressed

Many sophs informally reached out to the chair of the Student Experience Committee to voice their opinions that the costs associated with being a soph are too high. All of these sophs were unaware of the existence of the faculty soph team reserve. The committee subsequently put out a survey to sophs to gather more information on this issue, and consulted with the Coordinator, Orientation Initiatives.



Appendix 3

Summarized Results of Faculty Soph Team Reserve Survey (N=50 FOCA Sophs)

Approximately how much money do you spend on being a soph beyond your soph fee (\$30) and uniform (up to \$100) in a typical year? This can include things such as buying your first years presents, or miscellaneous orientation week expenses:

Minimum=\$20, Maximum=\$500, Average=\$153

On a scale of 1-5, how much do you agree with the following statement: The costs associated with being a FOCA soph are too high:

- 1 (strongly disagree) = 0 (0%)
- 2 (disagree)=2 (4%)
- 3 (neither agree nor disagree) = 10 (20%)
- 4 (agree)=20 (40%)
- 5 (strongly agree) = 18 (36%)

Are you aware that the USC has money allocated towards assisting sophs who are unable to pay their fees?

Yes=17 (34%)* No=33 (66%)

*Of the 17 that said yes, 5 (29%) knew how to access this money, while 12 (71%) did not.

Would you support a formal application and disbursement process of this fund for sophs, and making sophs aware of this fund?

Yes=50 (100%) No=0 (0%)

Would you consider applying for money from this fund if you were more aware of it?

Yes=38 (76%) No=12 (24%)

Ten written comments were also received, all of which either commented that the cost of being a Soph is too high and/or encouraged better promotion of and access to the Faculty Soph Team Reserve.
