Events Director(s) (2-3)

- Responsible for planning and executing various events in the Public Arts Portfolio, including but not limited to Nuit Violette and Reverie.
- Will work with committee to organize layout, setup, coordinate performances and speakers, etc
- Will coordinate events such as coffeehouses, silent auctions, galleries, and other events to promote the arts on campus with other coordinators, faculty councils, and clubs

Marketing Director (1)

- Responsible for coordinating innovative physical and social media promotional campaigns on campus and beyond
- Will manage social media for the USC Public Arts Commission
- Graphic Design/Videography skills are an asset but *not necessary*

Outreach Director (1)

- Responsible for coordinating with other programs, clubs, faculty councils, and organizations regarding upcoming events and initiatives, and potential opportunities for collaboration and cross-promotion
- Will recruit and organize volunteers for the different events and initiatives within the portfolio

Finance Director (1)

- Will work with the Public Arts Coordinator to budget for the various events, initiatives, and campaigns in the Public Arts portfolio
- Will manage finances related to silent auctions and other events

Faculty Liaison (1)

- Responsible for ensuring the needs, views, and opinions of faculty councils are expressed and given due consideration at USC Public Arts Commission Executive Meetings
- Will be the main point of contact for faculty councils and their representatives
